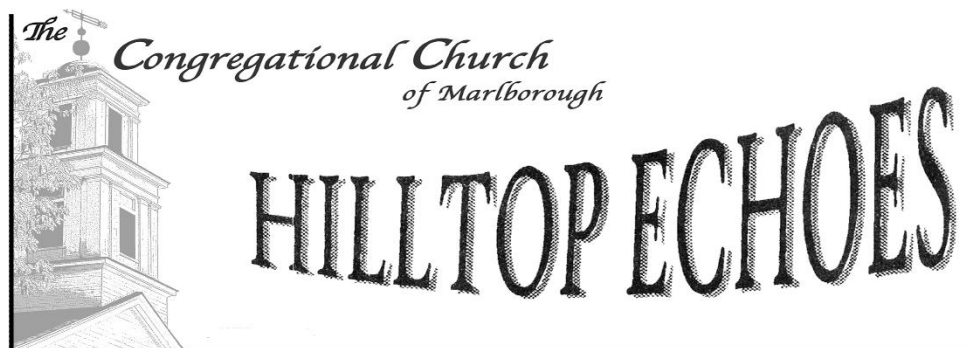

live at peace with everyone.*

Romans 12:8

It seems that we are living I a period of time when differences of opinion can't be expressed without triggering emotional negatives.

Not long ago, a friend we valued expressed hateful views of someone we thought we both respected. The conversation got quite heated, but I felt we parted on good terms...so much for my positive thinking...

Just because people can't agree on a subject doesn't mean that either is evil. Speech that's harsh or unaccepting of another's views shouldn't overcome common decency and compassion.

Romans 12 is a guide for living in harmony with other people. Pride and anger and in direct contrast to the love God wants us to show others. If we faithfully look for Jesus in others, we will find it easier to exchange views with those we disagree without contention and separation.
